

1 with Lincoln and Charles Keating.

2 Subsequently, they met in Senator Riegle's office for a
3 brief discussion. They had no discussion about setting up a
4 meeting with Ed Gray.

5 I would like to turn my attention to the meeting of
6 March 19th between Senator DeConcini and Senator McCain.

7 On March 19th, 1987, I believe the evidence will show,
8 Senator DeConcini's legislative assistant, Lorie Sedlmayr
9 came to Senator McCain's office with Senator McCain and
10 Gwendolyn van Paasschen, his legislative assistant.

11 Senator DeConcini told Senator McCain he wanted to meet
12 with Ed Gray in Gray's office about Lincoln. McCain was
13 troubled by the suggestion and did not commit himself to
14 such a meeting.

15 DeConcini also proposed that they travel to San
16 Francisco to meet with the Regulators examining Lincoln if
17 the visit with Gray did not work. McCain expressed his
18 desire not to go to San Francisco. He didn't think it was
19 appropriate.

20 On March 20th, as best we can tell, Senator McCain
21 declined to meet with Mr. Gray in his office. Senator
22 McCain drew the line. Under the circumstances, he did not
23 think it was appropriate and justified based upon the
24 limited amount of information he had in his possession.

25 Now according to the record, Senator DeConcini--and I
